Officials investigating controversial post from RHS rally

ROBERTSDALE — County and school officials are investigating after a social media post from a Robertsdale High School pep rally Friday sparked controversy over the weekend.

The Instagram post shows two Robertsdale High School students, one holding a sign that reads “Put the Panic back in Hispanic,” and another holding a Donald Trump, “Make America Great Again” banner, standing with the RHS mascot. Underneath the photo reads, “Put the Panic back in Hispanic” (fist-bump emoji) #dontgetButthurt (I’m honestly not gonna care if you do anyways so!!) #sorryboutit. (laughing and crying emoji and what appears to be a girl with hands on her head).

The photo was reposted by a fellow student with the comment “This happened yesterday at our school pep rally. They know it’s Hispanic Month. That’s very disrespectful in so many ways. But it’s funny to think that our school thinks it ‘OKAY’ this is Honestly what white trash looks like.”

The post has since been reposted more than 2,500 times and while there have been a few comments in the students’ defense, most are calling for action from the school and from the Baldwin County School System.

Soon after, Baldwin County School Superintendent Eddie Tyler issued a response on social media, “We are aware of a photo that appears to be taken



Easton Carraway wins battle against cancer

FOLEY — After months of living a nightmare of ups and downs, little Easton Carraway returned home from St. Jude’s Hospital on Sept 5, cancer free.

Earlier this year, after taking Easton to Women’s and Children’s Hospital for what appeared to be severe stomach aches, the results came back far worse. Easton was only 15-months-old when he was diagnosed with a rare form of

cancer. A tumor was growing in his pelvic area, and had spread to the muscle tissue around the pelvis as well as both lungs.

Once the diagnosis came, Easton and his parents, Foley fireman Cody and Kahlee Carraway, left for St. Jude’s Hospital, where they remained for months during Easton’s treatments. The family began a Facebook page shortly after, Easton’s Journey, where they gave updates to the community on Easton’s progress and recovery.

“We’re in a whirlwind now,” said Cody Carraway once the family arrived in Memphis. “We’re an emotional wreck, we don’t sleep, we’re just watching our baby that two weeks ago was running around and playing in the house now fighting for his life. It’s a nightmare that no other parent should have to go through.”

The very month Easton was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer, the Foley Fire Department

hosted a benefit to help raise funds for the medical bills, and the outpouring from the community was nothing short of amazing.

"We can't believe that the community has come together so much to be behind us," said Kahlee Carraway. "We really appreciate it. We're leaning on them."

Only a couple of months after arriving at St. Jude's, Easton began recovering with the help of chemotherapy, but it was far from an easy process. Months passed of intensive treatment, and the tumor continued to shrink in size, offering hope to the family and all those on Team Easton. Finally, in August, Easton had to go through a major lung surgery.

As Easton's dad Cody updated on their Facebook page: "The doctors originally thought they could do this procedure with a scope. Now they have decided they cannot. They said it's due to an air pocket in Easton's left lung where a tumor used to be. They will not be able to see the air pocket with a scope."

The results of the

procedure took 5 days to return, and during that time Easton had to have a chest tube and be inpatient. The surgery was successful, and on Aug 28, the family posted that Easton was cancer free. The road to recovery wasn't without its bumps, as shortly following the surgery Easton developed a high fever and found himself back in St. Jude's treatment. They brought his temperature back down to normal, and after a few days in observation, Easton was officially declared cancer-free and the family could return home.

"This journey is not over, there will be tons of tests and scans and blood work continuously until he is 18 years old," said Cody Carraway. "But he has defeated the evil cancer that was inside him. This kid is the strongest person I know. He goes through chemo and huge surgeries and miserable tests, and the minute he finishes he's right back to smiling and playing. Thank you all for the continued prayers and support thus far, y'all have got us through. Please continue to pray for Easton as he tackles the last few things standing in his way!"

Now at home, the Car-

raways are thrilled to find their son returning to normal. On some of the most recent updates on Easton's Journey, they state that his personality is returning quickly, and that his hair is growing as well. He is now playing and laughing through the day, and though he still has a long road ahead, Easton is recovering well.

One thing the Carraways state as being their biggest support through the rough times is their community, who came forward with an outpouring of love through texts, messages, and benefits to help support Easton and his harrowing battle. The fight is not over for many other children, and the community is continuing their support of Easton and the other children and families going through a similar situation.

"For the last 5 months, we've all essentially been a part of Team Easton," said Foley Fire Chief Joe Darby. "Little Easton's been at St. Jude's, and some wonderful things have come from that. Our city has embraced an opportunity to be a bigger part of St. Jude, we've seen firsthand what St. Jude does, and we know how important it is."

In honor of Child Can-

cer Awareness Month, states across America will be "going gold" to show their support, as well as participating in 63 separate walks across the country. One of the walks is for Mobile/Baldwin County, and will take place on Sept 23 at U.S.S. Battleship Memorial Park. People from around the counties have already signed up on Team Easton, and the Foley Fire Department will be in attendance to support the cause as well. Everyone is invited to attend and show their support of Team Easton and every patient at St. Jude's Hospital.

"I want to express my appreciation on behalf of that family for everything that's been done," said Darby. "Cody told me the very first trip they came back just to visit that he will forever be indebted to this city and to St. Jude. He needs that support, and I know it's going to be a long road still, but I appreciate that."

Outdoor Conditions Report: With the autumnal equinox happening on Friday September 22, the calendar says it's now officially fall. However, living along the Gulf Coast we know the seasons are a little "off" from the rest of the country. The same can be said for our fishing seasons.

As we await the first significant cold front of the fall season, the water is still warm and the fish are slow to come out of their summertime lethargy. Think about it: When it's hot outside who wants to run around and work up a sweat all day long? Fish are the same way and as soon as the water cools into their comfort zone (generally in the lower 70s, depending upon species) they will really turn on.

Another factor to pay attention to is the tide. A slack tide, where there is very little movement of water, isn't enough to stir up baitfish for the gamefish to feed. Look for periods of good tidal movement, between the high and low tide, to kick up the smaller fish and shrimp and stir larger fish into a feeding mood. Winds and rain also affect conditions such as water clarity. Better to wait a few days for conditions to stabilize. If you are heading out there, good luck and be safe!

Irma interrupts corn harvest, complicates cotton crop

Farmers are scouting for damage from Tropical Storm Irma, which dropped several inches of rain and blew winds up to 50 mph in east and central Alabama Monday.

The storm, which raged across the Florida peninsula last weekend, interrupted corn harvest for some Alabama growers, said the Alabama Farmers Federation's Carla Hornady.

"The rain pushed some farmers to work long days

through the weekend to gather their crops," said Hornady, the Federation's Cotton, Soybeans and Wheat & Feed Grain divisions director. "Thankfully, damage wasn't as widespread as predicted. It's a waiting game now to let fields dry before resuming harvest and determining the full extent of the storm's damage.

Russell County's Keith Thompson farms near Seale and is a crop insurance agent. While his 200-plus acres of corn weathered 3.5 inches of rain, he said farmers

farther north are dealing with corn flattened from wind gusts.

Cotton from Covington to Blount counties is twisted from wind damage, making defoliant applications more difficult, Hornady said.

Lint quality could suffer, too, for farmers like George Jeffcoat in Houston County.

"Cotton tangled by wind will probably cause leaves to shed prematurely," said Jeffcoat, the Federation's Southeast Area vice president. "Yields will be affected by wind damage

and silverleaf whiteflies, which we dealt with earlier."

Thompson said he was thankful Irma's damage was less than Hurricane Opal in October 1995.

"Wind beat our cotton up pretty badly, but if we can dry out with limited wind or rain we'll be okay," said 61-year-old Thompson, who has 350 acres of cotton and 400 acres of peanuts. "We'll see how the cotton will stand back up after a few days of sunshine."

In the Wiregrass, peanut farmers could benefit

from the tropical storm's moisture. The Alabama Peanut Producer Association's Caleb Bristow said sunny days should allow farmers to resume field work soon.

"The storm may wind

up helping more than it hurts," Bristow said. "Peanuts planted later will benefit from the rain, and farmers preparing for harvest will have plenty of moisture to disc up the peanuts."

at a Robertsdale High School football pep rally Friday Sept. 15 that is circulating on social media containing political banners and unacceptable language. School administrators, as well as my office, are following up on the matter."

In an email on Tuesday, which was sent to all BCBE employees, parents, key communicators and media, Tyler issued a follow-up statement both in English and in Spanish.

"The picture of these two signs together has created a firestorm of controversy," he said. "In light of DACA and the immigration debates underway in this country I can understand why. I am not going to debate but I do want to speak to the community about who we are and what we stand for."

The Baldwin County Public School System has one of the highest Hispanic enrollments of any school system in Alabama, the letter states. Robertsdale is among the highest in Baldwin County because of the many migrant workers who enter our country to work for local farmers in our fields. Baldwin County's ESL (English as a second language program) has been recognized by the state department of education for its excellence.

"Not only do we work hard to provide for these members of our community, but they are hugged on and loved every day not just by their teachers but by their friends where they go to school," he said.

Recently the Baldwin County Coliseum was opened as a storm shelter to more than 400 evacuees from Florida. People came from all walks of life, many of whom were Hispanic and nearly all without much financial support.

"Our parents and kids donated and volunteered to help these families

who were misplaced during their time here to the point that officials asked us to call off and redirect that call for help, because what being delivered was too much to process," Tyler states. "Unfortunately things happen. Sometimes young kids, young adults, say things they shouldn't say or in a way that can become controversial. Sometimes we don't see a context that someone else might see. I also know that you can't judge, or should not judge, a community by one picture, regardless of what the sign says."

Tyler said he has received an overwhelming number of emails since the Friday incident.

"Many have been calling for expulsion, lengthy suspension, banishment from all school related activities and to my disappointment several were very 'hateful' in nature," he said. "How ironic. There was one from a young lady out of state

that simply said, 'Mr. Tyler, I believe that you have a teachable moment here.'

Local television media reported that a statement has been issued through a "family attorney" from one of the students involved issuing an apology for the post.

After identifying herself as the student who held the "Panic" sign, she wrote:

"Sir I would like to inform you that, that wasn't my intention and was not meant for it to be taken that way. We played the Spanish Fort Toros on Friday night, I was meaning "panic the Toros" considering when I think Spanish I think Mexican or Hispanic.

"When I realized how people were taking it, I wasn't going to bring it. But my friend who had it in his truck brought it to the bleachers, when one of the boys sitting near me saw it and held it up.

"I do apologize for

making our school look bad and I do understand any consequences I must face. But I also believe in my right of speech. I did not mean it in any kind of racial way, half of my family are Hispanic. Thank you for your time

reading this, I apologize for all the publicity and misunderstandings this has brought to our school."

There has been no word yet if any official action will be taken in the matter, but Tyler ended his

email address with a message to students, faculty and employees.

Attorney General calls on Equifax to drop fees for credit monitoring

MONTGOMERY — Alabama Attorney General Steve Marshall is among 32 attorneys general calling on Equifax to drop fees it charges for its credit monitoring service and to reimburse consumers who were forced to pay for security freezes to their credit accounts as a result of the Equifax data breach.

“By Equifax’s own admission, the company suffered a massive data breach potentially compromising the credit of 143 million people,” said Attorney General Marshall. “While my office and those of many of my fellow attorneys general prepare to investigate the circumstances of this unprecedented data breach, it is important that Equifax stop efforts to profit off of the very same people who were victim of its own failure to protect their credit information.”

In their letter to Equifax, Attorney General

Marshall and the other attorneys general called on the credit management company to halt its fee-based services to consumers and to extend the period of signup for free credit monitoring until at least January 21, 2018.

“We object to Equifax seemingly using its own data breach as an opportunity to sell services to breach victims. Selling a fee-based product that competes with Equifax’s own free offer of credit monitoring services to victims of Equifax’s own data breach is unfair, particularly if consumers are not sure if their information was compromised. Equifax cannot reap benefits from confused consumers who are likely only visiting Equifax’s homepage because they are concerned about whether the breach affects them and their families.”

The attorneys general also voiced objection to

consumers being forced to pay for security freezes to their credit accounts as they attempt to protect themselves from Equifax’s data breach.

“Although Equifax is not charging consumers a fee for its own security freeze service, these consumers are furious that they have been forced to pay for a security freeze with other companies, such as Experian and TransUnion, when this privacy breach was no fault of their own. We agree with these consumers that it is indefensible that they be forced to pay fees to fully protect themselves from the fallout of Equifax’s data breach. Accordingly, we believe Equifax should, at a minimum, be taking steps to reimburse consumers who incur fees to completely freeze their credit.”

The attorneys general also asked Equifax to address complaints of long

wait times or the inability of consumers to access its call center.

“...[I]t has been generally reported that consumers are encountering long wait times or are unable to get through to your call center. We have received similar complaints from our consumers, who have also stated they cannot locate Equifax’s phone number on your website. We request that you feature your call center number more prominently on www.equifax.com and www.equifaxsecurity2017.com. In addition, this hotline should be available 24 hours a day and properly staffed to ensure shorter wait times.”

Separately, Attorney General Marshall warned Alabamians to be on the lookout for scammers hoping to take advantage of consumers’ concerns over the data breach.

“Although Equifax has informed attorneys general that it will not be

emailing, texting or calling impacted consumers, the Federal Trade Commission is reporting that fraudsters are already attempting to cash in on the unsuspecting public through phone scams,” said Attorney General Marshall. “I urge anyone who receives such a phone call, text or email to report it to the Alabama Attorney General’s Office at 1-800-392-5658.”

Tips for Consumers to Avoid being Victimized:

- Don’t give personal information. Don’t provide any personal or financial information unless you’ve initiated the call and it’s to a phone number you know is correct.
- Don’t trust caller ID. Scammers can spoof their numbers so it looks like they are calling from a particular company, even when they’re not.
- If you get a robocall,

hang up. Don’t press 1 to speak to a live operator or any other key to take your number off the list. If you respond by pressing any number, it will probably just lead to more robocalls.

- If you gave your personal information to an imposter, it’s time to change any compromised passwords, account numbers or security questions.
- Verify your credit reports with all three credit bureaus, Equifax, TransUnion, and Experian, by visiting <https://www.annualcreditreport.com>.
- Monitor existing accounts closely. Check bank and credit card statements for unauthorized charges.

Visitors to the idyllic town of Magnolia Springs can now launch their kayaks into the Magnolia River from a recently built launch.


A wide, beautiful boardwalk was built using BP

I've been told this is not "hunting proper," but there are enough people out there who kill snakes for no reason, and I refuse to be among their number.

So, hunters, enjoy the coming seasons and take joy and pride in watching your young ones come to know and love the sacred art of hunting.

However, keep a spare comic book or a nice chapter book handy, though, just in case you're blessed/cursed with a youngster more in my mold.

How we fund the government

ARGUABLY, CONGRESS'S MOST IMPORTANT POWER IS THE POWER OF THE PURSE. Through funding bills, Congress has an important opportunity to set the direction of the government. Founding Father James Madison called it "the most complete and effectual weapon with which any constitution can arm the immediate representatives of the people".

Unfortunately, in recent years, Congress has failed at this basic constitutional responsibility. For far too long, Congress has operated from manufactured crisis to manufactured crisis, putting off passing government funding bills until the last possible minute.

Even worse, Congress has also fallen into a bad habit of just passing short-term spending bills known as Continuing Resolutions (CR) that simply hold federal spending in place. This is exactly what happened just a few weeks ago. I voted against that bill because it's unacceptable to operate the government in that manner.

Fortunately, for the first time since 2009, the House last week passed all twelve of the individual government funding bills before the end of the fiscal year on September 30th. Only in Washington would simply doing your job be considered a major accomplishment, but this was a big breakthrough in the government funding process and it is important to enacting President Trump's agenda.

For example, our funding bills crack down on illegal immigration and fully fund President Trump's request for the border wall. The bills also roll back burdensome regulations, provide a raise to our troops, defund Planned Parenthood, cut funds to the IRS and EPA, and boost funding for medical research.

While I am proud we got the job

done, we still have a lot of work to do. For example, Congress has still not even passed a budget for Fiscal Year 2018 yet, and the Senate has yet to consider even a single funding bill.

I want to take a minute to clarify the difference between the federal budget and the funding bills. While the terms are often interchanged, they are actually very different.

The budget is more of an aspirational document that does not carry the force of law, but it serves as a blueprint for the funding bills. Even more, the budget submitted each year by the President is truly just a recommendation that Congress

uses to draft our own budget. Even still, the budget is important because it sets topline spending levels and provides a more long-term budget outlook.

The funding bills are where the money is actually spent. These are very specific bills that lay out line item ap-

propriations for most government agencies and programs. The funding bills run on the fiscal year calendar, so from October 1st to September 30th each year. If the funding bills are not passed before September 30th, a government shutdown occurs.

When the process works like it is supposed to, the president submits his budget request in February, the House and Senate pass budget resolutions by the middle of the year, and then pass the twelve individual funding bills by September 30th.

We must return to this process. When the system is broken, as it currently is, it makes it much harder to set federal priorities and cut down on wasteful or unnecessary government programs. This is why I think it is so important we return to regular order and get our work done on time.

I understand it is difficult to make spending decisions in today's tight budget environment, but the American people elected us to make difficult choices. While I'm glad the House got our work done this year, we must keep pushing to fix the overall process and restore fiscal sanity in Washington.

Notes from your Congressman

Turn school free speech issues into teachable moments

Several recent events within the Baldwin County School System have turned the focus onto freedom of speech for our county's students.

Events this summer at Spanish Fort High involving an AP Government class reading list led to SFHS senior Julia Coccaro submitting a formal complaint to the school system that several students' rights to free speech and freedom of expression had been trampled on by the school's administration - a complaint currently being investigated by an outside party at the school board's behest.

This week, another speech related controversy popped up in Robertsdale, as a social media post surfaced with students holding "Make America Great Again" signs and a homemade sign that read "Put the Panic back in Hispanic," which has led to investigations by county and school officials.

Moments like these are uncommon within the Baldwin County School System, and we feel they both present teachable moments to help instruct and advise our county's young people on what their rights are and how they can be exercised.

As members of the free press, our editorial board knows how important our First Amendment rights can be, but when it comes to our nation's schools, a different standard actually applies.

Many of us remember the words from the Supreme Court case of Tinker v. Des Moines Independent Community School District, that students "do not shed their rights at the schoolhouse gate" when it comes to free speech or expression.

That notion changed slightly in 1988 with another case, Hazelwood School

District v. Kuhlmeier, where the Supreme Court found in a 5-3 decision that school administrators had the right to exercise prior restraint of school-sponsored expression if that prior restraint is "reasonably related to legitimate pedagogical concerns."

Or, to put it simply, if it disrupts the ability of students to learn or faculty members to teach, administrators have the right and, some would argue, the responsibility to regulate and potentially censor speech and expression within their schools' walls.

Incidents like the ones we've had recently in our county show the importance of administrators exercising their rights to potentially censor speech and provides a perfect opportunity to explain to our students why certain types of speech or expression might be curtailed.

We urge our teachers and administrators to take these incidents and use them to help further educate students on a plethora of topics: freedoms of speech and expression and their limitations, appropriate speech, context and more.

Further equipping our children and grandchildren with more knowledge about how the world around them truly works will benefit us all.

Local pastor scores multiple victories for Baldwin County

FOLEY — Victory Life Church has a winning pastor serving the congregation. Pastor Frank Griffith became passionate about helping those in need after Category 5 Hurricane Camille hit Waveland, Miss. Although his family was a victim of the savage storm, Griffith's mother began cooking meals for area residents and continued to do so for several weeks. His mother's actions have since moved Griffith to respond in a similar fashion for several disasters.

In 1989, Griffith provided relief to victims and those affected by Hurricane Hugo which was a Category 4 storm at landfall just north of Charleston, S.C. After Hurricane Katrina made landfall in


2005 near Baras-Triumph, La., the Gulf Coast of Mississippi was heavily damaged and Griffith worked in Long Beach for six months helping victims and cleaning up the mess the storm left behind.

The year 2008 saw Griffith in Galveston, Texas where he worked out of a funeral home providing relief for those affected by Hurricane Ike. Griffith stayed in Phil Campbell, Al. for six weeks helping rebuild the community for victims of the April, 2011 Hackleburg-Phil Campbell EF5 wedge tornado that devastated several towns in Alabama.

After these events, Griffith continued helping those in need including victims of the 2013 Moore Tornado in Moore, Okla. and in 2016, Griffith responded to the West

Virginia flash flood event that produced widespread damage across several counties by providing help to the area. Most recently, Griffith led a relief trip on Aug. 30 at 4 a.m. to San Antonio, Texas in response to the disaster Hurricane Harvey left in the area. This trip would be the first of many trips that will bring supplies to the victims of Harvey including food that Griffith plans to use to set up a fulltime kitchen and feed the victims.

Along with providing relief for disasters, Griffith helps to provide missions work across the world including Ukraine, Honduras, Belarus, Nicaragua, Russia, Mexico, Turkey, and Greece. In addition to helping with mission work, Griffith has helped to establish orphanages in Ukraine, Honduras, Mex-

ico, and Russia. Griffith adopted a child from a Ukrainian orphanage who is now grown and a resident of Baldwin County.

As Griffith's compassion runs deep, he brought a young female child from Russia who had been given a botched ear operation. Her ear had become infected and the infection had begun to eat inside her skull. West Florida Hospital provided a free operation to correct the

previous operation and heal the child's ear and Victory Life Church paid for her transportation. The girl fully recovered and she is now a grown adult with children of her own.

Besides relief and outreach missions, Griffith helps the community here in Baldwin County with his teachings inside Victory Life Church. Griffith bases his way of teaching on the Bible, but he also

knows that fear, worry, stress, heartaches, and life in general can impede the journey of a joyous life.

According to Griffith's bio on VLC's website, Griffith says, "Today doesn't have to be a representation of what yesterday was like."

Griffith believes that with God all things are possible, but wants to help guide people towards a


In the 90s, Stephen King fans everywhere got their first taste of horror as one of his most famous and controversial books, *It*, was brought to life in a TV miniseries. Now, years later, a new version of "It" (2017) has come to theaters, and has amped up the game tremendously.

Unprepared for the horrors that await them, the children are pitted against a force that none of them could anticipate, and as the fear increases, so does Pennywise's hold. The remake of "It" hasn't taken any liberties with its

horror-genre, and King is one of the top masters of horror writing today. With a top-notch cast of child actors and a chilling Bill Skarsgård as Pennywise, "It" is full of terror, intensity, and shocking scenes that draw you in from the very beginning. With a hard "R" rating, the new remake is not one for the faint of heart.

Players Dailey, Rhodes also reach key stat marks

DAPHNE — When Bayside Academy's top-ranked and defending state champion (Class 3A) Admirals won their 2017 Battle by the Bay tournament Sept. 16, head coach Ann Schilling also reached career win No. 1,400.

The milestone victory was also the championship match win in three sets over Spanish

DAPHNE — Tennis players Alexander Zverev of Germany and Garbine Muguruza of Spain have been named the United States Sports Academy's Male and Female Athletes of the Month for August.

Zverev defeated current world No. 3 men's singles tennis player Roger Federer of Switzerland 6-3, 6-4 in the Rogers Cup final Aug. 14 in Mon-

treal. It was Zverev's second consecutive tournament win in August, having earlier in the month defeated Kevin Anderson 6-4, 6-4 to win the Citi Open in Washington, D.C. Zverev is now ranked fourth in the world in the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) rankings for men's singles.

Muguruza defeated Romania's Simona Halep 6-1, 6-0 to win the Western & Southern Open title in Cincinnati Aug. 20.

It was Muguruza's second win of the season after she claimed victory at Wimbledon earlier in the year. She defeated a host of top players on the way to the finals including American Madison Keys, the Czech Republic's Karolina Pliskova and Russia's Svetlana Kuznetsova, and is currently the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) top ranked singles player.

He hit .349 with a .433 on base percentage, and 24 of his 38 hits went for extra bases. He broke a Miami Marlins record for most home runs in a season after hitting his 43rd of the season on 14 August 2017.

Barshim won gold in the men's high jump by clearing 2.35 meters (7 feet and 8.52 inches) at the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) World Championships in August. He followed that performance by clearing 2.4 meters (7 feet and 10.49 inches) at the IAAF Diamond League meet later in the month, setting a meet record and a world leading mark for this year.

The second place finisher on the women's side was American runner Emma Coburn and third place went to American softball player Kelly Barnhill.

Coburn broke an International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) World Championships record with a time

of 9:02.58 to win gold in the 3,000 meter steeplechase on 11 August 2017. Coburn is the first American since 1952 to win gold in the steeplechase at the World Championships. Her time shaved five seconds off her own American record.

Barnhill pitched a complete game no-hitter as the United States women's national softball team defeated Mexico 9-0 and won the Pan American Championship in the Dominican Republic on 13 August 2017. Barnhill finished the tournament with a 3-0 record, 40 strikeouts and a 0.35 ERA in 20 innings of work.

The Academy's American Sport Art Museum and Archives (ASAMA) annually recognizes these men and women through its Sport Artist of the Year, Honorary Doctorates, Medallion Series, Distinguished Service Awards, Outstanding Athletes, and Alumni of the Year

awards. This is the 33rd year of the Academy's Awards of Sport program.

The United States Sports Academy is an independent, non-profit, accredited, special mission sports university created to serve the nation and world with programs in instruction, research and service. The role of the Academy is to prepare men and women for careers in the profession of sports.

Founded in 1984, ASAMA is dedicated to the preservation of sports art, history, and literature. The ASAMA collection is composed of more than 1,800 works of sport art across a variety of media, including paintings, sculptures, assemblages, prints and photographs. 

path of righteousness by 'walking together in this journey of life'. Griffith and VLC have several ministries to help anyone seeking the Word of God. For children, there is the Children Ministry which is a different environment than the adult ministries. Although the

Children Ministry is fun and exciting, it is also a very serious church service designed with their needs in mind and conveying biblical truths in ways that a child can understand.

VLC also has a Ladies Ministry known as DIVAS (Divine, Inspirational, Virtuous, Anointed Sisters). These women get together for fellowship and biblical teachings each month. have.







Santa Rosa Fair. In the months since, Jacey has worked diligently with her cows every day to bring home a win from the Baldwin County Fair this week.

Her cows, five in all, are walked daily. They are bathed daily. She sprays them with conditioner. They dry, not in the sweltering Alabama sun like the rest of us common folk, but rather under the shade of a custom built shed with fans blowing their lovely locks to and fro.

The shade and air movement between the follicles helps the hair grow longer and faster, Jacey explains.

But this much divine diva presence is certainly not drama free.

It's been a long summer that you could say, went somewhat off the rails at Off the Rail Farms. And this week is crunch time in the Adkins house.

"I'm excited, I have a new heifer, that's really exciting," Jacey says. Nearby her mom grimaces and smiles. The countdown to show time has begun.

Learning the Ropes

The six kids of the Adkins family have long been involved in local scouts and 4-H activities. Her mom used to show lambs. Her brother has shown chickens and goats. Four years ago mom Cari Adkins suggested Jacey try showing heifers. It might be fun, she said.

The long hours and dedication are more than fun for Jacey. She said these animals are part of her heart.

"I just love working with them. It's calming," she said. "These animals rely on me. That's nice to know."

During that first show Jacey prepped and worked with a cow she borrowed from a local farmer and won \$400 in winnings. She put that together with chore and birthday money to save for a cow of her very own.

After months of re-

search, she landed on British White Cattle as her breed of choice. The family drove to a breeder in North Alabama to make the deal.

The asking price was \$1,500. While her parents waited away from the negotiating table, Jacey told the farmer in no uncertain terms that she had saved \$1,000 and that was what she was willing, and able, to pay.

He agreed that this budding businesswoman should have her way.

Jacey brought home her first cow, Shimmer, and together they won the title of supreme champion at the Baldwin County Fair in 2015. Afterwards Shimmer sold for a cool \$2,500.

Jacey continued to work and save and headed to the auction again, this time for a calf she would name Trainwreck. Despite her name, Trainwreck was a superstar who won several competitions, most recently named grand champion at the Santa Rosa Fair.

"At that show, no one could compete with her," Jacey said. "That was a great day."

When the fair season ended, at just 2-years-old Trainwreck would retire at the top of her game. By fall of 2017 she would be too old to show again. Jacey planned to use the heifer as a 4-H breeding project and hopefully show Trainwreck and her calf on the 2017-18 fair circuit.

The teen went back to work, researching and saving. She tracked the genetic histories of possible semen donors for Trainwreck. The heifer, she says, has a larger front end and a smaller back end, a trait that could be balanced out in a calf with the right bloodline.

Finally, she picked a donor and Trainwreck was artificially inseminated in November of 2016.

The baby would arrive in August, 2017.

The morning of her birth Trainwreck headed out into the back fields and never returned at feeding time. That night, Jacey went to find her. When she did, the afterbirth was still hanging from Trainwreck but the calf was nowhere to be seen.

When Jacey and her parents finally found the baby, it was still. Her father and mother gave the calf mouth-to-mouth. The air went in but the lungs didn't fill. Instead, the calf's stomach did.

Trainwreck's baby was born without a set of lungs — an unfortunate genetic defect common to the breed.

The loss was devastating for the family.

"There was just nothing we could do," Jacey said.

Still, she continued on. Jacey began to look online for another heifer to show, now just one month before the fair.

Her parents agreed to put money toward the purchase as well as a gift for her 14th birthday which falls just days before the fair. Jacey had worked too hard, too long to stop now, Cari said. Without a new calf she would essentially be taking a year off from the shows.

But calf sales are few in the fall. And most of the breeds the family wanted were raised far from the

Deep South.

She found one online, in Ohio, and entered the auction. After three days of waiting, and hoping, Jacey lost the bid.

She searched again. And one week before the fair, she and her father headed to Iowa to pick up her new heifer, a 500-pound Maine-Anjou, who came registered with the name Miss Angel, a moniker Jacey petitioned to change to Maineline.

Maineline has never been walked on a lead. Maineline, at six-months-old, had just been separated from her mother. Jacey had a lot of work to do.

Showtime

Jacey will enter the ring in four days with Maineline.

This morning, Maineline is hiding behind another cow when Jacey approaches. Jacey pulls the lead forward. Maineline pulls the lead back. Jacey eventually wins the tug of war as Maineline steps tentatively forward, never fully submitting to the directions of her new owner.

But, Jacey is confident. She and Maineline will click. She will show well. The teen has spent the last year skipping sleepovers with friends and vacations. Every morning she is up with the sun to bathe, groom and care for her an-

imals. She is determined to do her best.

The teen, who is homeschooled, aspires to be an agricultural engineer and design barns for livestock. Her 4-H heifer breeding project will help build her resume. Three beef cows she cares for, shows and sells will help build her coffers.

The threesome, Buddy, Vegas and Andre, have been with Jacey since nearly birth. She bottle-fed two of them and now they follow her around the field like puppies rather than nearly 1,000-pound animals.

She lines all three up every day to wash and groom their soft, luxurious black hair. In the days immediately before the fair, those who need it will be treated to a dye treatment. Natural black cow hair turns red in the sun. Jacey uses human hair dye to return them to their natural shade of midnight — four bottles per cow.

An insider tip, cow hair dye is more expensive and doesn't last nearly as long as human hair dye, Jacey says.

Each cow will be clipped and styled too. Jacey and her mom do the manicuring though some competitors will hire professional groomers at a cost of \$200 - \$500, per cow.

Is it cheating?

"I don't mind," Cari says. "When we go head to

head with a professionally groomed animal and win, I feel pretty good about that."

Eventually, Buddy, Vegas and Andre will be sold, for meat.

"We've been teaching the kids that everybody has their job," Cari says. "Just because they're not going to be with us long doesn't mean we can't love and care for them."

In addition to having gorgeous animals, Jacey has to show the judges that she is a pro at caring for them. She hauls out giant books that contain records for food, weight, vaccinations, vet visits and more. She printed out every bit of research she has on each cow's lineage. She talks about her animals much like a mother talks about her newborn, every hiccup, every diaper. Jacey knows her cows.

This week, between the brushing and the hair dye and the primping, Jacey and Maineline will continue to walk, and walk and walk, until the teen has determined she will set up in front of the judges without issue.

On their first walk, Maineline, who was unaccustomed to wearing a halter, reared back and landed on Jacey.

"She's gotten better though," Jacey says cheerfully.

Cari sighs. Four days to go.
